

Top 10 Iceland Tips!

1. Iceland has so many world-class attractions that are right next to the main road. One of those is Seljalandsfoss-- a waterfall you can walk behind!



2. Some roads in Iceland are called F Roads. These roads are only open in the summer, are not paved, require a 4 wheel drive vehicle, and sometimes involve extreme river crossings.

Make sure your GPS doesn't send you on an F Road!

3. Make sure to check three web sites every day if you're driving yourself: Road.is, Safetravel.is, and en.vedur.is. There you'll find road conditions,



travel warnings, and weather warnings.



4. Reynisfjara is a stunning black sand beach on Iceland's South Coast. But don't get near the water-- the waves can be much more extreme than you expect! People die here almost every year.

5. If you have T-Mobile or Sprint, you'll get free low-speed data in Iceland. If you have AT&T or Verizon, you'll need to buy a data package or buy an Icelandic SIM card. You can order a SIM card to be delivered on your Icelandair flight!

6. US credit card works everywhere, except some won't work at unmanned gas pumps. Buy a gift card from an N1 or Orkan gas station just to be safe.



7. Don't drink ANY alcohol if you're driving. Icelandic rules are very strict!

8. One US dollar is worth about 135 Icelandic Krona right now (ISK). Icelanders switch decimals and commas. So 10.000 means ten thousand krona (about \$73 US.)

9. Almost everywhere in Iceland, the cold water from the tap is literally spring water. Never buy bottled water-- people around the world pay for the water you can get for free!

10. Be sure to swim in a local thermal pool, no matter what time of year it is! Every town has one with geothermally heated water.



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
